Investigator Brethauer and Inspector Lancaster responded to investigate complaint#15390V5M-30E regarding concerns of overcrowding. Complaint was deemed founded due to animals being housed together that should have been separated due to sexual status.

Licensee was there during the walkthrough of the facility. She had to leave, but allowed Designated Representative Jamie Walters to sign for the report. Licensee was on facetime as we discussed the report.

B. Drainage: 2. Non-Compliant

Severity 1 (Outdoor): K.A.R. 9-18-10. (f)(2) General requirements for housing facilities. (f) Drainage and waste disposal. (2) If present, disposal facilities and drainage systems shall be properly constructed, installed, and maintained in such a manner to avoid all foul odors and any backup of sewage.

Piece of feces was located on the asphalt in the outdoor play yard. I also observed one leash, a broom and a chair located alongside the outside wall of the building in the outdoor play yard. I asked licensee how they clean the outdoor play yards and she stated that they don't because they do not use this play yard for anything, including walking dogs. She did state that she has brushed a dog previously in the outdoor play yard.

Inadequate drainage system in outdoor play yards was cited on previous inspection reports and no new system has been implemented.

To be corrected on: 9/28/2023

A. Separation: 2. Non-Compliant



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Severity 1 (Indoor): K.A.R. 9-18-16. Separation of animals by gender. All sexually intact adult animals shall be housed separately from all other sexually intact adult animals of the opposite sex within an animal shelter, rescue network, or pet animal foster home.

In "Main" kennel #25, 3 Australian Shepherds were housed in one kennel with different sexual status'. Those dogs are described as:

"Yuzzum" a 1 year and 7 month old unaltered female

"Gungan" a 4 year and 4 month old intact male

"Ortolan" a 5 month and 3 week old intact male

Housed in "B" in one kennel was:

"Weequay" a 3 year and 5 month old unaltered female Toy Australian Shepherd

"Dressellians" a 5 month and 3 week old intact male Bischon

All of the animals were moved to other kennels during the inspection.

A. Pest Control: 2. Non-Compliant

Severity 5 (Indoor): K.A.R. 9-18-14. Cleaning, sanitization, and pest control. (c) Each licensee shall establish and maintain an effective program for the control of insects and external parasites affecting animals. Additionally, the licensee shall develop a plan for the management of birds and mammals that are pests or potential hazards so as to promote the health and well-being of the animals and reduce contamination by pests in animal areas.

I observed one live roach type insect crawling on the floor in "Main". I pointed to the bug crawling on the floor and licensee then squashed the bug prior to Investigator Brethauer taking a picture of it. We observed a Blue Beetle employee (Pest Control Company) previously on site during the inspection. Either the Licensee's pest control management system isn't affective or the sanitization, cleaning or facility construction issues previously cited are not adequate to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the animals due to the risk of disease spread via cockroaches.

A. Pet Animal Foster Homes : 2. Non-Compliant

K.A.R. 9-18-28. Pet animal foster homes.(i)(1) An animal shelter licensee or rescue network manager shall not place any intact dog or cat six months of age or older into the custody of a pet animal foster home unless spaying or neutering is contraindicated by a licensed veterinarian. If a veterinarian has examined and recommends that the dog or cat should not be altered, the pet animal foster home shall obtain a copy of a written opinion by the veterinarian as to why the animal cannot be altered and an estimated time of when, if ever, the animal can be altered. A copy of the written opinion shall be kept by both the pet animal foster home and the rescue network manager or animal shelter licensee.

Severity Level: 1 Correction Date: 9-28-2023

"Gand" a 4 year old 7 month old intact male Cavalier King Charles currently in foster after intake date of 9-27-2023 without any documentation stating the animal had been altered prior to foster placement.
